


To sign up as a parent or carer to Unifrog please use the following guidance.

Go to: Unifrog - The complete destinations platform, and click on sign in

Your parent sign-up code is: HLCCparents

This code effectively acts like a one-time pass code so any parent signing up will only need to use it once - the very first time they login. Parents need to click on the words 'use it here' in this box on the right hand side of the 'sign in' page:





The sign-up code goes in the top box, they fill in the rest of the details and set their own password. The Sign-up code identifies the user as a parent so they are kept totally separate from your live students (they'll appear on your 'Advanced' page with a leaving year of 2050) - from this point onwards, once their account is set up, they login with their email address and whichever password they set for themselves on the above sign-up page.

King's Medicine and Dentistry Lecture Series 2023

The national King's College London Medicine and Dentistry Lecture Series 2023 are now open! This programme is for students across the UK in Year 11, 12, and 13 who have only attended non-selective state schools since age 11 and are interested in becoming a doctor or dentist.

Over the course of the 14 lecture programme students will hear from a variety of speakers to help them make the best application to medicine or dentistry possible! Last year's lectures included the following:

- Medical and dental specialities: cardiology, prosthodontics, renal transplant, and many more!
- Q&As each week with current medical and dental students as well as a lecture dedicated to the student experience.
- A session on other careers in healthcare with six professionals currently working and teaching in the sector (nursing, dietetics, clinical science, etc.)
- September Q&A with key admissions colleagues in the schools of medicine and dentistry at KCL and UCL.

Lectures on the application process: the UCAT, personal statements, and interviews.

Lectures will be held on Tuesday evenings at 6-7.15pm and will run in blocks of three throughout 2023. The first three lectures will take place on the 31st January, 7th February, and 14th February. The remaining three blocks of lectures will take place in Spring and Summer.

OUR COLLEGE CAREERS ADVISOR:

Students in Year 10 and 11 are provided with small group and 1:1 guidance interviews. Year 11 students have started to see our careers advisor and will continue with these appointments throughout the term. During Year 11 all students will be offered 1:1 careers guidance interviews. At these interviews students will create a careers plan which they can use to support them in their transition to the next stage of education. Students will now be given a printed copy of this plan so they can share their discussions with parents and carers.

EVENT FOR ENTERPRISE AND MARKETING STUDENTS



The College is always looking at ways to support our students' development of key skills and careers which includes visits from a number of employers across a range of sectors. On Thursday 3rd November, year 10 and 11 Enterprise and Marketing students took part in a 'Dragons Den' style activity delivered by the Army. This event included a presentation on the support side job opportunities available in the Army, as well as a practical activity which involved students building a product they believe the Army would. During the build, the team needed to work together and think about a number of factors including the cost of their product, the impact they intend for it to have, and how they are they are going to pitch it. The students, whilst some a little nervous about presenting their ideas, thoroughly got involved and made the most of the activity, bringing their practical and creative skills together to deliver some interesting ideas. Their product ideas ranged from an electric scooter, to a multi-use catapult, to a cargo transporter! Well done to all those involved.



On Tuesday 8th—Friday 11th November, Year 9 and 11 joined Helston Community College staff on a trip to see the facilities at Falmouth University Campus, Penryn.

Students had an opportunity to see a range of the departments at the University, including, Games Design, Photography, Art, Fine Art and Advertising.

Students experienced what it was like to be in a lecture and have lunch in the student restaurant. Falmouth University also spoke to all students about pathways post 16 and student finance. It was a great day and the students were well engaged, asking lots of well thought out questions.



In Drama lessons this term KS3 students have been watching, analyse and evaluate recorded professional performances of Romeo and Juliet, Peter Pan and Treasure Island from the Royal Shakespeare Company and the National Theatre. Not only have the students considered the acting but they have also been introduced to the wide variety of career pathways in theatre – costume, set, sound and lighting design along with directing and producing. Often we focus on the actors but there is so much going on in the background to bring these wonderful productions to life.

On Wednesday 23rd November Year 11 students were offered the opportunity to take part in mock interviews, with local employers. We had 33 businesses that helped support this event, conducting 112 interviews throughout the evening.

MAKING SPACE FOR NATURE







On Wednesday 16th November, students from Helston Community College's Sustainability and Climate Change Group worked with Cornwall Council's 'Making Space for Nature' and CORMAC staff in Helston's King George V Playing Field and Coronation Gardens. The work being carried out will improve the park environment for nature and for people.
